Godly Play: Exodus

In this story we see that God was with the People as they "went out" (the literal meaning of the word exodus) from slavery into freedom through water. The People of God look back to this time to sustain them when God is hidden and they feel lost. For the Jews, the Feast of Passover keeps this core event alive. For Christians, Baptism reawakens this event.

Bringing Godly Play Home:

The story of the Exodus as told in Godly Play is "telescoped" so as not to distract children from the primary narrative. At home you can talk about the story of Joseph and his brothers (Gen 42). You can also talk about the different plagues in detail: the Godly play narrative simply says "many strange things happened in the land," but does not list specifics.
