Making Space for Epiphany

On the first day of Christmas, my true love gave to me...

On the second day...

On the third day...

Okay, are we almost done?

Twelve Days of Christmas — the song references the season of celebration that follows Christmas Day and leads--twelve days later--to Epiphany! Twelve days of celebration and festivities...sounds about right, doesn't it?

See, the problem is that so many of us front load our Christmas celebrations by preparing for Advent, that by the time we reach December 26, we are ready to box it all up and be done!

I hope this note finds you in such a place. Really. Because we have now entered January and find ourselves in the

Season of Epiphany — the days that invite us, like the wise travelers in the Gospel of Matthew, to remain in the presence of Christ. Has Christmas worn you out? Perhaps it would be the very best thing to do to box up all the presents, the tree, and make your life a bit more spare in this season, preparing space for the true gifts of the Savior to be discovered.

How can you clear space, after weeks of celebration, for Christ's light to shine in? Can you open up the curtains and crack the windows in your hearts and homes so that the light lift you up? Can you find spaces where you can reflect and be inspired by the love of Christ that has been so generously given to each of us? May you find this blessed light of Epiphany,.

NOVEMBER FINANCIAL STATUS

Our expenses exceed our income through November in the amount of -\$12,030. Our projected budget deficit for 2018 is -\$10,982. Hopefully the December financials will show a reduction in this deficit to end the year.

2018 STEWARDSHIP UPDATE

St. James has received 59 pledges for a total pledged amount for 2019 of \$160,416. As you can see this amount is short of the goal of \$190,000. The goal was intended to cover commitments that Session has approved during the 2018 year for 2019.

2019 BUDGET FOR ST. JAMES

Session has approved a budget for 2019 which shows that our projected expenses will exceed our projected income by -\$34,015. There is a very minor portion of our budgets that can be adjusted without impacting staffing. Staffing is by far our largest expense each year. The Finance Committee encourages all members to attend the annual membership meeting that will be held **January 27th**, **2019** right after our morning worship service. The annual report should be available to read a week before the meeting. Come prepared to ask questions.

GODLY PLAY SCHEDULE

January 6^{th:} Epiphany

In this lesson we remember the arrival of the Magi in Bethlehem. We will recall together all the weeks in Advent as we had before Christmas but give special attention to the final purple candle, the one that represents the three kings. We will stop here and pay attention to what the three gifts were and what they symbolize as gifts for a baby who is the Messiah.

January 13th: Holy Baptism

In this lesson we learn that Baptism is full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into the Church. For Christians, this rite is the gateway into the family of families we call the Church. We ask the children to remember or look forward to the day of their baptism by lighting candles from the light of the Christ Candle, since this is also the day they receive their "light."

January 20th: Parable of the Good Shepherd

In this lesson we hear the parable of the Good Shepherd, in which the shepherd searches for his one lost sheep, leaving the other ninety-nine to do so. This parable is often considered more of an identity statement than a parable.
