## How Long, O Lord?

Christ's peace be with you,

We continue to witness unrest in our nation and around our world. We are confused and worried about the future. We feel defeated, as if there is no way forward, no clear path beyond all that we face. We mourn the death of George Floyd and all the black bodies lost too soon to injustice that he represents. We mourn the hundreds of thousands of lives lost to the coronavirus and the despair and uncertainty they represent.

In our despair, we want to find words to address all that is not right. We want to speak up, we want to have answers, we want to run to hope. And yet, if you're like me, it feels like so often you have nothing to say, no words to adequately soothe the pain.



In times like these, I am grateful for the language of lament, the language of the Psalms, the language of God's people who have lived through times of tumult and great upheaval.

If you have no words for today, no answers, then I encourage you to turn to the Psalms in prayer. Littered throughout the book of prayers and praises, there are numerous Psalms of grief and longing. These Psalms of Lament give us language when we have no words, speak truth when we cannot. Psalms 44, 60, 74, 79, 80, 85, and 90 are traditionally regarded as the Psalms of communal lament for the people of God.

Today, I am sharing with you Psalm 90, for your prayer, reflection, and lament. We pray, "Turn, O Lord! How long?"

#### Psalm 90: God's Eternity and Human Frailty

1 Lord, you have been our dwelling place in all generations. 2 Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God. 3 You turn us back to dust and say, "Turn back, you mortals." 4 For a thousand years in your sight are like yesterday when it is past, or like a watch in the night. 5 You sleep them away; they are like a dream, like grass that is renewed in the morning; 6 in the morning it flourishes and is renewed; in the evening it fades and withers. 7 For we are consumed by your anger; by your wrath, we are overwhelmed. 8 You have set our iniquities before you, our secret sins in the light of your countenance. 9 For all our days pass away under your wrath; our years come to an end like a sigh. 10 The days of our life are seventy years, or perhaps eighty, if we are strong; even then their span is only toil and trouble; they are soon gone, and we fly away. 11 Who considers the power of your anger? Your wrath is as great as the fear that is due you. 12 So teach us to count our days that we may gain a wise heart. 13 Turn, O'Lord! How long? Have compassion on your servants! 14 Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, so that we may rejoice and be glad all our days. 15 Make us glad as many days as you have afflicted us, and as many years as we have seen evil. 16 Let your work be manifest to your servants, and your glorious power to their children. 17 Let the favor of the Lord our God be upon us, and prosper for us the work of our hands—O Prosper the work of our hands!

# **MAY FINANCE UPDATE**

Each week, as our commitment to 'Stay Home, Stay Healthy' has continued, we are called to a deeper trust in God, with all areas of our lives - including our finances. And, with that trust comes a great deal of discernment as to what is best given our particular circumstances, whatever those may be. This is true for us as a Session, as a worshipping community, and for us individually. Our Session, the Finance Committee, and the Church Staff are thankful for the ways God continues to sustain us - we communicate regularly about how to best steward our resources during this time.

## Following is an update on Saint James Year to Date General Operating Budget. A few highlights:

- Year to date, our income is still ahead of expenses!
- Since we have moved to 'Church At Home Together' overall pledges are less than what we projected pre-pandemic.
- Online giving has increased.
- The Presbyterian Board of Pensions is providing relief money to offset our monthly payments for a brief period. As well, Northwest Coast Presbytery is providing grants for some of the technology updates that have helped us make the move to online church services.

## • June 28th The Holy Trinity


This lesson combines 3 narratives, transforming them into the concept of the Holy Trinity
