For the Beauty of the Earth

As summer draws to a close, we look back upon the beautiful weather we have had here in Bellingham and are grateful for the opportunities we have had to be outdoors with friends, soaking in the beauty of God's creation. And now we look forward into the fall with this beauty lingering in our minds, primed to ask how we can continue to steward God's creation well, how to honor all that is good and beautiful, and how to protect and preserve all creation as good stewards of God's reign here on Earth.

In 2015, Pope Francis declared September 1 to be a World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. In the years that have followed, Christians around the world have taken it upon themselves to engage this day with faithful contemplation and action on behalf of the earth and the crisis which faces our



global climate. We mark this day again this year by remembering "the Earth is the Lord's and all that is in it..." (Psalm 24:1). All creation cries out to God, giving glory to God's goodness and groaning in longing for health and flourishing for all.

As I have prepared for preaching this fall, I have been wondering at how we are to take matters of such present significance and crisis, such as climate change and its effects, and listen to them with the heart of Jesus. I have wondered at how Jesus' wisdom and teaching can inform our actions and engagement with issues of climate science, environmental stewardship, and working with complex geopolitical issues that face humanity today. If the earth is the Lord's and therefore belongs to Jesus, how do his parables and teachings inform us as disciples in how we act and live today? This is an enduring question of the faith and I am acutely aware of its importance today.

What I have found as I have explored the Scriptures and specifically looked at Jesus' parables is that Jesus offers wisdom to very complex issues. Wisdom that does not bring easy, quick answers. But a way of living that enters into the complexity, rather than shying away; a way of engagement that faces the challenges of science and politics with a grounding in the truth that God's love can and does work within these issues to lead us to the hope of all creation flourishing.

In the month of September, we will be engaging the question of climate change in our worship each week, through the lens of Jesus' teaching. We will be worshipping and serving alongside millions of other Christians, around the world, who are choosing to take a proactive step in engaging the wicked problems of an environmental disaster from the angle of hope and possibility. We will see that in Jesus' teachings calls to humility, sacrifice, and urgency that embolden those who follow him to act faithfully and act now. The Church has faced many great challenges through its history: war, famine, genocide, racism, persecution. The wisdom of Jesus has and will continue to provide us with a lens for how to live amidst all these challenges. And, through it all, the Church has persisted, modeled hope for all humanity and all creation, sought the flourishing and wholeness of all, for the glory of God and for the life of the world. And today, we continue this work, anticipating God's continued love and faithfulness to us, now and forever. Amen.

FINANCE UPDATE

The Stewardship Campaign is traditional during the month of October. This campaign is especially important due to the joys and growth with the increase in the number of children that are participating in Godly Play and other activities during this year. We also have four youths to get a start with having a youth program. A year ago Session approved and hired Tracy Caruso as Director of Children and Family Ministries. Tracy and her staff have really provided a great start for the future of children as an important part of St. James. As this program continues to grow, additional funds are necessary to financially provide support. While there is more to the life of St. James, our children should head the list.

The focus of the campaign this fall is totally on the financial support to St. James. Based on our current commitments for 2019, the church needs pledging commitments that will add up to \$200,000 plus just to maintain the status quo.

Per Capita is clearly an annual expense to the Presbytery based on our membership. Finance has chosen to remove this item from the pledge form this year and include the total cost as a line item in our budget. You can still contribute separately if you so desire. The use of a tree last year to show our support was a good idea but a more basic tool is needed to show progress with pledging commitments during the month. A meter will be located in the Narthex to clearly show our status on a weekly basis. The packet this fall will briefly address our needs with children, local mission information, and worship related information. If you have been contributing on a regular basis during the year, a statement as to your status of contributions will be included. Therefore, each packet will be unique to you. Packets with no names identified will also be available.

As a reminder, pledging to St. James over the past three years has stagnated. This level cannot continue and still maintain the commitments that we currently have in place. This level will not allow any growth either. As the church ages along with its members, we are experiencing some additional expenses which have not existed due to the efforts of several members who have donated their expertise. We thank them for all that they have done for decades. We are starting to pay for some of these efforts. The budget for 2019 reflects a situation that our expenses for this year could exceed our total income by \$35,000. So far, our treasurer has predicted a deficit less than this amount. Historically the budget is used as a good tool to compare income and expenses during the year. Deficit budgets are not a good path to follow as there are always some things that surface during the year that were not part of the budget. We do not have a slush fund.

The kickoff for this campaign will be on September 29th. Plan to attend the church that Sunday and pick up your packet after the service. Read the information, fill out the pledge form, and return it to the church quickly to reflect on the meter in the Narthex that we are serious to financially support St. James for 2020. Let's watch our commitments fill up the meter such that it is full to the top by November 1, 2019. (\$200,000 +). LET'S STEP UP AND SUPPORT ST. JAMES FOR 2020!
