Saying Grace

In the month ahead, many of us will gather around tables for meals with loved ones, friends and family. Some of us will travel long distances or receive guests from afar; whether near or far, we come together to eat, share stories, and experience each other's company--sometimes after much time apart. It is the season of Thanksgiving, the time of year we return to God gratitude for the abundant harvest: a table filled with enough and lives nourished from God's hand.

As is common for many Christians who gather at table over the Thanksgiving holiday, we practice "saying grace." I grew up listening to my grandparents, parents, uncles and aunts gathering our family together with a word of prayer in response to God's bountiful providence. Saying "grace", puts the words of thankfulness upon our lips. As we speak "grace" aloud, we acknowledge before (and with) others the ways we have personally and communally been impacted by God's providing love.

"Saying grace" is a tradition, but I think there is much more for us to experience in this practice than we typically allow. Sometimes, saying "grace" can be a perfunctory act—the hosting task, the obligation, the liturgical movement that inaugurates the meal. This year, I wonder if we might hear an invitation to experience "grace" as something beyond just words. Could "grace" be an offering—something given and received as we gather at the table? Could we find a capacity around our tables this November---and the months to come--to know "grace" in the core of our being? Could we receive others in love, and allow ourselves to be received as well?

What might this look like? Surrender allows me to recognize my need to give and receive grace, both to others and to myself. I have to accept my own need for grace: for my weaknesses, for my shortcomings, for moments I have squandered the good, spoken carelessly, or been quick to judge.

The grace I receive allows me to offer grace to others: grace for the friend at the table who said a harsh word to me last week, grace for the sibling we wish had not actually shown up to the meal...How are you invited to know grace more deeply? Who around you needs to experience grace — an unconditional welcome, forgiveness, or reconciliation? Where do you need to experience grace?

Grace--rooted in Christ--is not perfunctory, but bold. I write this note in the closing days of October, the month when the church remembers the historic boldness of Martin Luther, who nailed his ninety-five theses to the Wittenberg church door, the same man from whom our reformed tradition gratefully received the strong reminder that it is by "grace" we are saved. We are and are becoming a people of grace. Wholeheartedly.

What is offered to each of us today is that Christ Jesus welcomes us in grace. It is in Christ we find the true meaning of saying and *living grace* — "go now and sin no more." Christ's grace sets us free to then go and fully release others. As we give and receive grace, we open up our hearts to God, to others, and to our world. May we receive this grace more wholly, now and always.

Godly Play for November November 4th: The Ark and the Tent Moses experienced God's presence on Mt. Sinai, but also in the tent of meeting. In addition, God's presence

was in—or more likely seated on—a throne above the ark of YHWH (a box or chest that contained at least the tablets of the commandments, and possibly the rod of Aaron and a vessel of manna). This story describes how the two traditions of the tent and the ark came together in the tabernacle.

November 11th: *The Ark and the Temple*

In this story we see a continuation of the travels the tablets of the commandments took. We see new way for thinking for the people of God in regard to the experience of God's presence.

November 18th: *The Exile and Return*

In this story, the Babylonians capture Jerusalem and take God's People into exile. Even though this journey is forced upon them, they make an astonishing discovery: God is not just in one place, in the temple in Jerusalem, but also in a foreign and strange land. God's presence is not here or there, but everywhere, waiting. To be found. To find us.
