St. James Children's Ministries

April 2: Hope Against All Hope. Focus scripture is John 11:1-45. Children will learn about God's compassion. Adults can demonstrate this quality by the way they handle the feelings of young children.

April 9: Passion Amidst the Palms. Focus scripture: Matthew 21:1-11 and 26:14 through 27:66. All ages explore the challenges Jesus faced during the days before his death. Think about how to express this concept to youngsters.

April 16: Yes! Focus scripture: John 20:1-18. Help younger children appreciate the joy of Easter and guide older ones to explore its mystery.

April 23: It's True! Focus scripture is John 20:1-18. Retell the Easter story and emphasize that Jesus is present wherever we are.



April 30: Followers of the Way. Focus scripture: Luke 24:13-35. Children begin to learn the connection of sharing bread (a meal) with each other to sharing bread in church.


Flowers Committee members - New blooms please!
