

THE PULSE

As I sit down to compose this article, mid-January, I realize I'm still sometimes writing 2015 on the few checks I still use. Time marches on, sometimes catching us by surprise; at least it does me. Lent's impending arrival also catches me somewhat off guard. It feels like we just celebrated Christmas, and my focus is on the season of Epiphany, yet Ash Wednesday is just around the corner. Like last year, Lent arrives early in 2016.

So, I turn my thoughts to Lent and to its significance for believers. Lent, of course, is the period in which we prepare for Easter, the celebration of Jesus' Resurrection. Traditionally, it is a time of penitence and reflection, a season for examining our lives for evidence of faithfulness, a time for fasting and prayer, and for some, a time to give something up, whether that means depriving oneself of an indulgence, like coffee or chocolate, as sacrifice offered to God, or giving up a bad habit in an effort to shape one's life more in keeping with God's intentions.

Lent can also be a time to take something on, practicing a spiritual discipline or engaging in an act of compassion, doing something meant to bring one closer to God. The past several years here at Saint James, a group has gathered to read and discuss a book together, led by the pastor. I invite you to that Lenten practice this year.

The book I've selected is *City of God: Faith in the Streets*, by Sara Miles. Here is a description: "From the acclaimed author of *Take This Bread* and *Jesus Freak* comes a powerful new account of venturing beyond the borders of religion into the unpredictable territory of faith. On Ash Wednesday, 2012, Sara Miles and her friends left their church buildings and carried ashes to the buzzing city streets: the crowded dollar stores, beauty shops, hospital waiting rooms, street corners and fast-food joints of her neighborhood. They marked the foreheads of neighbors and strangers, sharing blessings with waitresses and drunks, believers and doubters alike. *City of God* narrates the events

of the day in vivid detail, exploring the profound implications of touching strangers with a reminder of common mortality. . . *City of God* is a beautifully written personal narrative, rich in complex, real-life characters, and full of the 'wild, funny, joyful, raucous, reverent' moments of struggle and faith that have made Miles one of the most enthralling Christian writers of our time."

This book not only addresses traditional Lenten themes like mortality and repentance, but also raises questions about how the church relates to its community. It invites us to reflect on where we find God, and where we experience "church."

We will meet Sundays, February 21 through March 20, at 4:30 p.m. for discussion, followed by a soup supper. Books will be available ahead of time for those participating. I invite you to consider joining me on this Lenten journey.

Who can come?

Everyone is welcome! Please feel free to bring along a friend or family member. Do not think you are too old or young to come along; you can always relax and enjoy the beautiful views from the lodge if you are not feeling energetic.

Where is Tall Timber Ranch?

Tall Timber is a Presbyterian camp off of Steven’s Pass about 45 minutes away from Leavenworth. Address: 27875 White River Road, Leavenworth - Directions: Drive Highway 2 from Everett to the Lake Wenatchee. Turnoff, 20 miles east of the Steven’s Pass summit. Drive around Lake Wenatchee (Hwy. 207 for 10.4 mi.) to the far end and turn right onto the White River Road. Camp is 6 miles up the White River Road. www.talltimber.org

When is it?

President’s Day Weekend
After dinner on Friday, February 12 through Monday, February 15, after brunch.
If arranged ahead of time, you can come early and stay Thursday night.



How much is it?

\$139.50 per person for the weekend, including food and lodging
\$70 for children ages 5-10, children ages 4 and under are free (but still included in the count)
Meals include breakfast, lunch, and dinner on Saturday and Sunday, and brunch on Monday. If enough people are interested, we will have a Friday dinner option for an extra fee.

The fees include using the tube hill, skate park, and/or renting cross country skis or snow shoes.

What do we do there?

- Activities include:
- cross country skiing through the lovely mountainous countryside
 - snowshoeing through the wilderness
 - sliding down the tube hill on inner tubes (under supervision)
 - playing cards or board games in the lodge (or working on a group puzzle)
 - relaxing in the lodge with a good book or just sitting around and chatting with hot chocolate or tea
 - informal Sunday worship service



Accommodations:

We will be staying in Tall Timber Ranch’s Schulze Center. There are 8 separate bedrooms, each with a queen sized bed and a bunk bed. Bathrooms are shared. There is a public social area and kitchen. You will need to bring your own bedding (sleeping bags or queen (or twin) sized sheets, blankets & pillows) and towels. We also have use of the main lodge for games and meal times. The Schulze Center is right next to the parking lot, so it will be easy for people to arrive or leave at any time. There is also a small cabin behind Schulze Center with no bathroom facilities which can provide extra beds if needed.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

Income has been found to develop a budget designed to cover projected expenses are not expected to vary and there is sufficient money set aside for the pastor-seeking process. The Pastor Nominating Committee potential nominees were discussed with careful consideration of creating a committee in accord with guidelines to have it represent our demographics related to gender and age, as well as, special skills or experiences. A slate should be ready for review on Sunday, April 24, prior to the Annual meeting when a PNC election is scheduled.

The Regular meeting of the Session was moved to Saturday, January 30, 2016 to coincide with the annual Elder and Deacon retreat scheduled for that morning.
