
### From the St. James Women's Association

PW circles and groups field test and provide feedback on the author's first draft. Bible study authors are smart and faithful women who know PW.

The PW Purpose calls Presbyterian Women to nurture faith through prayer and Bible study. The studies are written in the Reformed Tradition and reflect the values of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). All of our studies can be read by individuals, but it is what the individuals discover together through group prayer and Bible study that nurtures Presbyterian Women.

**Stewardship Campaign 2017 Closure and 2018 Budget**

We have received 61 responses. We wish to thank everyone for these responses. The results in pledges for 2018 are \$166,524. This amount is used to prepare our budget for 2018. Pledging for 2017 was \$163,096.

Our goal for both 2107 and 2018 is \$200,000. Financial support is a key factor in sustaining St. James and in seeking growth in the future. Though our pledging through November is \$2,000 below budget, the generosity in general offerings is far exceeding expectations. Consequently, we are about \$14,500 ahead in total income which is good news.

We have presented a positive budget for 2018 and Session has approved it. A key factor is that we will show our end of the year excess funds as an income item as General Fund Income.

The Annual Membership meeting is January 21,2018. Plan to attend this meeting to answer questions you may have.

**MATTHEW 2:1-12**



In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.'" Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage."

When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.



### Godly Play

*Godly Play, is our educational program for kids age 4 through 5th grade.*

Jan. 7: Children's understanding of the Christmas season broadens when all of the elements of Advent -- Bethlehem, the Holy Family and the Christ Candle merge to tell the story of Epiphany. The spirit of Christmas continues to surround people.

Jan. 14: Holy Baptism, the story of Jesus's baptism, might remind the children of the baptisms that occurred in October at St. James. Children will see similar elements: a bowl with water; a pitcher; a dove; fragrant oil; and candles. They will be reminded that Jesus knows them by name.

Jan. 21: Children learn about Jesus's storytelling when they hear the Parable of the Good Shepherd. Children learn that God loves and forgives all of us -- as the shepherd searched for the one lost sheep.
