Music Theology at the Time of Lent

By the fourth century, the Western church had determined that the Lenten period of fasting and renewal should correspond to Christ's forty-day fast (Matthew 4:2), and, by counting forty days back from Easter (excluding Sundays, which remain "feast" days), arrived at the Wednesday seven weeks before Easter. Ash Wednesday, as it is commonly known, thus marks the beginning of the Lenten season.

At one time Lent was primarily viewed as a period during which converts prepared for baptism on Easter Sunday, but later the season became a general time of penitence and renewal for all Christians. Ash Wednesday, which was celebrated this year on February 18, marks the beginning of the Lenten renewal.

Thank you to everyone who contributed to our Lenten devotional. The booklet, which is now available, includes scriptures and meditations for each of the forty days of Lent. We hope that it will provide you with the needed encouragement as you contemplate this holy season. In addition, we invite you to consider attending the Lenten study from 4:30pm – 6:30pm each Sunday in March. We will be studying Anne Lamott's book entitled *Small Victories: Spotting Improbable Moments of Grace*. You can buy a copy from the main office for \$17.50 or speak with Pastor Jon if you need assistance with the purchase. Soup will also be provided.

Reflections from Our Pastor

April 2015 marks my fourth anniversary as your Pastor. This means that I have now had many moments to evaluate the strengths of our community, as well as to listen to your hopes and dreams for the future. What follows are some of my thoughts, in no particular order.

Strengths:

- 1) In the past four years, we have increased our focus upon mission and service. One example of this involves our partnership with the Interfaith Coalition. In addition to our regular contributions, we provided funding to provide solar panels at Our House, a triplex for homeless families in Ferndale. As a congregation, we also made a three year commitment of funds from our general budget to provide \$10,000 in support of the construction of Our House and maintenance of other Interfaith Coalition housing. We gave \$4,500 in 2014 and have pledged \$2,500 in 2015. Our work with Interfaith is a great example of Saint James' desire to engage in ecumenical, mission-focused service that will benefit those in need as well as the environment.
- 2) Every church claims to be "friendly and welcoming," but this is often not the case. All too often, visitors feel ignored or judged. You are a compassionate, loving community that seeks to be inclusive. This does not mean that we have reached our goal of making Saint James a safe and welcoming place for all people, but it does mean that our hearts are in the right place. I commend you for this, even as we acknowledge that we can always do more to engage new faces in our midst.
- 3) When I arrived in 2011, our building was outdated in many ways. According to our Buildings and Grounds Committee, the church was suffering from decades of deferred maintenance. Looking back, it is incredible how much you have accomplished in such a short time. The church is beginning to sparkle with new carpeting, vinyl flooring, windows, paint, a fantastic mural, tasteful artwork, and energy-efficient lighting. The new classroom downstairs was once a dingy storage area. It's hard to even imagine what it once looked like. Thank you for all of your patience, commitment, and hard-work during this transformative process throughout the building.

- I also mentioned that I have been listening to your considerations for the future. Over the years, these are some of the key issues that you have brought to my attention. I have shared each of these with the responsible committees.
- 1) From the time of my arrival, greater accessibility has been a major focus of discussion. Many have said that they would like to see us add an elevator to our facility. The challenge, of course, is the great expense involved with a project of this kind. For this reason, others have suggested lower-cost options, such as a chair lift for the staircase. At present, it appears that this would require a fairly expensive redesign and rebuilding of our existing staircase leading from the narthex to the fellowship hall, in addition to the cost of the equipment. Some in our community have suggested expanding one or more of the bathrooms on the main level to bring them up to current American Disabilities Act (ADA) standards. As you can imagine, each of these projects involve thoughtful planning, careful research, numerous bids, and adequate funding. The Buildings and Grounds Committee is aware of these requests, and appreciates your patience as they continue to investigate these issues.
- 2) Solar panels for our church have also been suggested. Session has approved a Task Force which is currently investigating this issue. We are expecting the Task Force to complete its work in the next several months and to present its findings to Session at that time. If you have comments or questions about this process, please don't hesitate to ask.
- 3) Often, you have expressed to me that young adults, youth, and children are vastly under-represented in our church. As you are well aware, this is a national trend which is particularly pronounced in places such as the Pacific Northwest. Saint James has experienced a number of difficulties since the late 1970's, including more than one painful, pastoral transition. Our shifting demographics did not happen overnight. It was a slow and gradual process. So too, rebuilding a ministry that is appealing to younger people will take time, commitment, and energy.


