Conversion. Communion. Calling.

Friends, in this season, I invite you to be converted change your heart and open yourselves to a new, freeing relationship with your finances and gifts. I invite you to communion — to know and be known by a community of people who share in a common work together, caring for one another and for God's good earth. And I invite you deeper into calling — to live out our collective vocation in the world through acts of generosity.

I pray that we can have eyes to see and ears to hear all the good that God is doing in our midst. Take up this invitation to conversion, communion, and calling as you share from the abundance of God's gifts in your life.
