THE WEARY WORLD REJOICES



What's that, you say? Are you tired? Are you weary? Let's not play games — 2020 has been one of the more challenging years in our lifetimes. No matter how you spin it, we have gone through a lot and are tired. And so we enter into the season of Advent worn down and longing for hope more than we might usually.

What do we do? We put up lights, we decorate the tree. We send and receive Christmas cards. And we turn our eyes and hearts to the Nativity, where the manger lays empty, and we wait. We wait for the coming of the Christ child, the one who we hope so deeply will bring about a new way, a rise of justice, a bit of relief, and the promise of salvation from our weariness.

This Advent season, we will practice the movements of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love in our "at home, at distant" worshipping life. My hope

would be that we start to hear the words of Christ's promised coming as all the more vital to our survival and sustenance this year.

Over the four weeks of Advent, our worshipping life will revolve around this theme: "The Weary World Rejoices!" Drawn from lyrics of the Frenchman Placide Clappeau's "O Holy Night," our Sunday services will look at how a weary world can possibly rejoice! How can such a thing happen? It starts by embracing the promise of "a thrill of hope." It comes into greater fullness as "the soul (feels) it's worth." The joy continues as we are "led by the light of faith" into the anointing of God's presence in our lives. And we experience the love of God that awakens us up so that "all within us praises Christ's holy name!" This progression is one of rising, awakening, light dawning in a way that breaks through the weariness and shows us new life. The power of our Christian witness is that we rejoice despite the darkness, facing the pain and suffering, in protest against injustices we see all around, and in the hope that the weariness and sorrow only last for a moment, but the joy of Christ's love comes in the morning. I invite you to embrace the difference of this season of Advent as an opportunity to experience this hope of Christ again, for the first time.

Much of our church's Advent practices usually revolve around festivities in our building, music in the sanctuary, lighting candles, making wreaths, children running around with stomachs full of too much gingerbread. This year will be different. Perhaps out of the weariness, we can instead find a quieter, softer way to experience the dawning of Christ's light at home. A lit candle, a beloved piece of music on the stereo, a Zoom call with a friend we miss dearly. Maybe the awakening will come by bundling up with our closest people, our quarantine crew, and going for a walk in the December stillness. Or perhaps you'll be ambitious and sing as you walk! (You know, singing outside is totally allowed during the COVID-19 phases). How will you embrace this season of weariness? In closing, I want to offer a straightforward encouragement and call: If you are lonely, if you feel too tired to carry on, please know that you have a community with your church family that loves you and wants to support you. And know that while this is a lonely time, the Presence of the one who brings light out of darkness walks with you, holds you, and will sustain you. For this, we are grateful.

A message from Carol Dellecker and the PCUSA

"Many hands make light work." "Teamwork makes the dream work." "If we all do a little, it adds up to a lot."

There are lots of ways to say it — but working together really does make bigger and better things possible. And, lots of times, working together makes it more fun, too. In fact, there are times made better just by our ability to be together, to be with one another.

That is something that really rings true, doesn't it? Being together. During these past months, many of us weren't able to be together in person. We have always been together in spirit and in faith. But we missed seeing each other. We missed seeing faces we love — up close and personal. But that doesn't mean we haven't been together. And we definitely have not been alone.

There is a word that comes up a lot during this season we call Advent in the Church, and it points to the same sentiment, but about God: "Emmanuel." Emmanuel means "God is with us," and, in Jesus, we Christians claim

that God took on human form to be with us. "God is with us" is more than just saying God is along for the ride. It states God values togetherness and relationship with us, leading us to value togetherness and relationship with one another. When we are all together as we are today — and even when we are apart.

The Christmas Joy Offering is one way we join together as Presbyterians from around the country. We do this to meet the needs of vulnerable people we might not be able to meet as individuals or as single congregations. We might not be able to meet face to face with those who need the support that our gifts provide, but we are very much still together.

The gifts we share connect us. They also change lives. Through the Christmas Joy Offering, we and others support church workers and their families who experience critical financial needs through help from the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions. We connect with the young people attending Stillman College, Presbyterian Pan American School, and the Menaul School, supporting the education and leadership development for students of color, who will soon be leaders in our Church and in the world.
