UNEVEN ODDS

Sleeping At Last's Atlas: Volume 1 is one of my favorite musical collections, which I return to repeatedly. It compiles a series of EPs of songs exploring themes of Darkness, Light, the Solar System, Land, and Oceans. I've written many sermons and papers while listening to these beautiful songs.

One particular favorite song of mine is titled <u>"Uneven Odds."</u> It's a heartbreaking story of a child reckoning with a world in which they've lost their mother to illness and father to despair. It is sung from the child's guardian's perspective, who must "make sense of God's love in these fires of hell" that the child faces. Here's the chorus:

Maybe your light is a seed, And the darkness, the dirt. In spite of the uneven odds Beauty lifts from the earth.

DarkNESS Exists to make light truly count.

It is Spring of 2021. We are moving into the season of Eastertide, the beautiful aftermath of the resurrection, and the hope of death undone. And, as we all know, this has been a year of "uneven odds." For so many, the world's odds seem to continue to unfair, unbalanced, uneven, never in our favor. The most recent series of mass shootings highlight just one instance of these injustices and the "unevenness of things." (I lament the words "series of mass shootings"...how can we have a series of such things!! Lord, have mercy.)

But, as the song says, there is hope. "In spite of the uneven odds, beauty lifts from the earth." We thank God for Spring, which reminds us of the power of that which can lift through the dark earth and emerge with new life. We step out of the longest winter and see the signs of life breaking through and bringing hope. There is a crackle of energy in the air around Bellingham. People are getting vaccines, stores and restaurants are slowly reopening, school buses can once again be seen filled with children on their way to learn and grow. (I have discovered a practice of offering a word of thanks to God when I get stuck behind a school bus with a red stop sign out or have to slow down to 20 mph because of the blinking light of a school zone! What joy!)

We know that these little things are mere signs of a greater hope we hold. As the people of God, we are a people of hope and imagination. We know that the odds are uneven, but in spite of them, we resist and discover hope for what is coming, what emerges from the ashes of lent and the rich earth of the grave: resurrection life.

I know that how we meet as a church and how we carry out our mission in the world has dramatically shifted this past year. And through it, I hope we can find a new way of celebrating God's goodness in our life together that will emerge from the fertile earth. There is such beauty to come — and we can be the ones who till the soil, lift the dirt, move ahead in the hope of the resurrection life we have found ourselves.

The song closes with these words, spoken to the grieving child:

You're much too young now So I'll write these words down: Darkness exists To make light truly count.

May we discover the life which bursts through the ground in this season and hold fast to the hope of Christ that binds us together.

FINANCE COMMITTEE UPDATE - March 2021

Entering the New Normal

Due to continued, faithful giving and a return to a "new normal" St. James began March in the black! We are incredibly blessed to have been able to continue our ministry with healthy finances. Comparing 2020 and 2021 to years past, the trends in our expenses and income seem to be relatively consistent with what we see in non-pandemic times.

A few important things to note as St. James and our region begins to open up:

- Income was slightly less than expenses in February 2021, but overall we have an almost \$7,000 excess year-to-date.
- Utilizing our Facilities Endowment funds (including some extra leftover from the Sanctuary Refresh), we
 are continuing to make tech upgrades to help us with our hybrid worship, as well as we replaced our water
 heater.
- Tenant use continues to resume.
- We celebrate Luke Arnold shifting into the position of Music Director and Pianist!
- First-quarter of mission disbursements were sent.



Session Meeting Highlights - March 14, 2021

- All session members were present for this virtual meeting.
- Deacon Representative, Jean Seater, reported that the deacons keep in close contact with the members. Several folks have already been vaccinated. The deacons will provide information and assistance as we begin to have conversations about reopening the building for the Sunday morning worship service.
- Treasurer Marina McLeod presented a review of the budget for February:

Beginning balance, 2/1/21	\$ 7,510.64
Income	\$16,873.92
Expenses	\$17,397.72
Ending balance, 2/28/21	\$ 6,986.84



- Elder Susan Diemont-Conwell is the lead elder for the logistics of re-opening the building for worship in the weeks ahead. She will continue to follow the reopening guidelines with a consistent, unifying approach.
- The Mission and Social Action committee reported that distributions have been made for the first quarter giving, with homelessness as a major concern.
- Christian Faith Formation committee is planning a children's scavenger hunt for Easter Morning.
- Pastor Seth is working with the pastoral teams of Cordata Presbyterian Church and First Presbyterian Church to plan the services for Maundy Thursday and Good Friday.
- The session voted not to have a session meeting in April. The next meeting of the session will be on May 2nd.

The Pentecost Special Offering takes place April 5th - May 23rd. The Pentecost Offering unites us in a church-wide effort to support young people and inspire them to share their faith, ideas, and unique gifts with the church and the world. 25% supports Young Adult volunteers, 25% supports Ministries with Youth, 10% is devoted to children at-risk and 40% stays with this congregation to develop and support programs for young people in our own church and community. Greetings from the Director of Children and Family Ministries!



Spring is here! With the increase in the sun and daylight hours, we are also hopefully seeing the light at the end of the tunnel of this past year of dealing with covid 19. It has been good to see a few more people during our in-person worship and we look forward to when it is safe for us all to be able to be together again. For those watching on Zoom, you will continue to see the Godly Play story video told from the classroom. For those who are in the sanctuary, you will see my silent reenactment. Both should be equally entertaining ;). We finished up our study of Resmaa Menaken's book *My Grandmother's Hands*. It was a wonderful melding of discussion and meditation practices led by Glory Johnson. We will be continuing our work on racism and social justice, look for more information to follow.

April 4th is Easter! We are planning a socially distanced Easter "scavenger hunt" for the kids this year. This will be for families to participate in together, not just for the kids. As we continue to open up I will keep you all posted on when our nursery and classrooms will be opening up and what our guidelines will be. For now, I hope to see you all on Easter! Godly Play for April

- April 4th: Easter Eggs. The folk celebration of Easter Eggs brings delight this time of year. Our culture's Easter Eggs have little to do with Easter that is celebrated in churches, but the eggs of Eastern Europe do. In this lesson, children are introduced to those eggs in a way to reclaim a wonderful sign of new life in Easter.
- April 11th: Work Day.
- April 18th: Jesus and the Twelve. This lesson tells the stories of the disciples of Jesus, who we now call apostles.
- April 25th: The Good Shepherd and World Communion. This lesson sets the story of the Good Shepherd next to Holy Communion to deepen each other's interpretation.

SJP Mission Partners: Lighthouse Mission

The Mission and Social Action Team met recently to decide how and when to disburse our 2021 quarterly donations to our local, national, and international mission partners. We decided our first quarter recipients would be those agencies assisting the homeless.

One of St. James' community partners serving the homeless is Lighthouse Mission. Lighthouse Mission has been operating here in Bellingham since 1923. As the Lighthouse Mission statement reads, our goal is "Healing homelessness with Christ's power and love." This organization provides shelter, medications, case management, recovery and support, and prayer and pastoral counseling.

Being homeless can take approximately thirty-six years of your life; life expectancy for the homeless is between forty-two and fifty-two years. On any given night, an average of 210 people are served by Lighthouse Mission. There are many programs in place through Lighthouse Mission, including Base Camp, the Ascent Program for men's recovery, Agape Home for women and women with children, The Good Neighbor Project, and outreach through the Street Connect program. Here's a recent story from one of our MSA team members:

"Here's my "slice of life" story from yesterday: I stopped by Naan to pick up my lunch, a woman there was picking up 12 meals for street people who refused to stay in the shelter. Three men hung around outside waiting to help her distribute the food nearby. She knew their names and while not socially distanced, all wore masks. She's from Ontario. Lives in Blaine. Told me of her & her husband's life of helping people in the US for the last 15 years. Her 9 months pregnant adult daughter was with her, mostly waiting in the SUV. She seemed to be doing this on her own and she didn't ask me to help fund it."

We're also working with the Finance Committee and those with expertise in the behavioral health field to see if there are any discretionary funds available, and if so, where to distribute them to best assist with the behavioral health needs in our community.


Mark Your Calendars! An evening of storytelling to support Interfaith Coalition


ST. JAMES CALENDAR
