From Generation to Generation - December 2022

The Season of Advent marks the beginning of a new liturgical year and a return to Jesus' annunciation and birth story. It is a season to look ahead, in the hope we hold for Christmas, anticipating the arrival of the Christ-child, God with us. It is also a season to look back and remember our forebears, who, from generation to generation, passed on the stories and way of faith to us. We respond with gratitude, reverence, and awe during such times.

This year, we are studying through the narrative of Jesus' birth story, using a beautifully crafted curriculum of texts, art, and devotional tools provided by A Sanctified Art . This arts collective gathers liturgies, visuals, and biblical commentary to support churches with creative resources throughout the liturgical year. This year's Advent story weaves together the sense of memory and anticipation from generation to generation, sharing the good news like the first visitors to Christ's manger went and did.



During Advent, we will look at the stories of Jesus' lineage, parents, and family and hear of those who came to visit him upon his birth. Well-worn stories will breathe new life in us as we consider the simplicity and mundane nature of Christ's birth — a poor child, born to migrant parents, under the watchful eye of imperial and local power, come to set us all free through his loving life. And as we recall Jesus' story, we are also invited to reflect upon our own stories, our narratives of how God has been with us through the generations.

As you decorate your home this year, I'm sure you will remember stories of where particular ornaments and candle stands, dishes and recipes come from in your family's story. Each year, we set out my Grandmother's Christmas mugs, beautifully simple with their holly and berry adornment, ready to be filled with holiday warmth and sipped from beside the tree. These mugs tell part of my story, helping me remember where I have come from and to whom I belong. I imagine you have an item or piece of decoration that evokes these kinds of memories for you. What story does it tell? How do you share this memory with others to keep these stories alive today?

Advent is also a season for us to gather close to one another and remember together. To hold hope together. To sing of the newborn Christ as a community, a people who share this hope that God would be with us here today. We stand in contrast to a world that often divides and insulates us from one another. We sing and gather in conscious defiance of all that would keep us separate, all that says, "There's no room for you here." And in this gathering, we find that there is absolutely room for us in God's story. We belong at the side of Christ's cradle, welcoming this beloved child. We belong together as we support those who are hurting and longing for the hope of Christ's light to show up and shine in our darkness. We gather to BE that light for one another!

I hope you will join us through this season. We have Advent devotionals available each Sunday in the church narthex, free to take and reflect upon during this season. We will celebrate Christmas Eve together at 7 pm on December 24 AND gather for a simple worship service to celebrate Christmas Day at 10:30 am on December 25. Come as you are, bring your family and friends, and share this generational story of God with us through the ages.

STEWARDSHIP UPDATE & LOOKING AHEAD TO 2023

Greetings and Happy Advent! On behalf of the St. James Session and Finance Committee, thank you to those who have submitted a pledge towards our 2023 Stewardship Campaign. As of November 30, 36 pledgers have committed to giving upwards of \$160,000 towards our general operating budget in the coming year. If you are able to join in these efforts, it is not too late!

In order to meet our goal of increasing staff salaries while also maximizing our giving towards mission and social action, we hope to raise \$40,000 more in pledges. Thank you for your ongoing prayers, service, and support. I continue to be in awe of the unique ways God works through the St. James community to bring hope and connection to our hurting, fragmented world.

On a final note, as we wrap up 2022, we continue to work with Avlon Financial to help us finalize year to date reports related to our general operating budget, endowments, and designated funds. These reports, along with the final pledge numbers will help Session finalize next year's budget.
