#### **Seasons**

"For every time, there is a season." Ecclesiastes 3.

I'll confess, I know I've written a note like this before (possibly multiple times). But with the change of seasons and the full bloom of Summer all around us, I'm once again drawn to reflect upon how the seasons of our days impact us and teach us about the rhythms of God's life.

Recently, I've spent a good deal of time outside. Bike rides around Bellingham, exploring Larrabee State Park (*photo on right*) and sitting beside a slow, meandering river in Central Washington. All of these outdoor places serve as markers of time to me, places I go to in hopes of remembering who I am and where and when in time and space I am.



Have you stepped back recently to consider "when" you are? As the seasons of the year change, we also notice changes in ourselves. We are changing beings, growing and shifting within our seasons of life. I've noticed this in myself as I move out of an intense period of learning and growing through more school, now able to breathe and take stock of the current "when" I am in now. I've seen it in my family as my elders age and the children around me mature.

And we notice it in our shared life together as a church. With a fresh season, new relationships begin, and old, familiar friendships rekindle and shift to new orientations. I think about our community at St. James Presbyterian and can notice immense shifts in us over the 6+ years I have been privileged to serve as Pastor.

I'm reading a great book this month on how the Christian mind understands the movement of time and the rhythms of these seasons. Author James K. A. Smith ask, "What season are we in?" How might we embrace what he calls "seasonality" to appreciate our time and station? Smith uses the example of how we eat foods in their appropriate season — berries ripening in the summer months clue me in and say "eat fresh" or can and store for the future. We do this in a particular season that calls for particular actions and duties.

Summer, for us, is a season to rest and connect. In our liturgical context, this part of our yearly cycle is a time to fill our cups with readings from the Old Testament, where we are reminded of the core stories of the Hebrew Scriptures. It is a time to pray and sing the Psalms, get in touch with our emotions, and check the status of our hearts at a time when we might have a little more capacity. We move into stories of Jesus' ministry, diving in deeper than the focused narratives of Advent, Lent, and Easter allow. We have an opportunity in this season to see the grander, wider story of God as it plays out in the Scriptures and around us.

I often feel the urge to do "the new thing," find a way to reinvent what we do in life to make it fresh and not grow stagnant. But what seasons remind me of is the opportunity we have to return, again and again, to the rhythms of growth, harvest, decay, dormancy, and renewal, year after year. Sure, we've been here before. We've reflected on these things in the past. But how does THIS "when" draw us closer to Christ? What is God teaching us this time around?

May we continue to hold one another in prayer and friendship through the seasons as the body of Christ.

## **SESSION HIGHLIGHTS**


