#### Wintering

I gathered with a group of Northwest Coast Presbytery pastors in mid-January at Rosario Beach, near Deception Pass State Park. I had not attended the Annual Pastor's Retreat before, and I was, admittedly, tired and a little reluctant to spend such focused time with colleagues.

Thankfully, it was a delightful time. We ate together, prayed and worshipped, and had ample downtime to rest and explore the coastal wilds of the Salish Sea.

Rev. Laura Terasaki, our Executive Presbyter, led sessions loosely tied to Katherine May's book, "*Wintering: The Power of Rest and Retreat in Difficult Times.*" As a



group, we recognized that this is a difficult season to be leaders in the Church and how important it is for us all to rest and find ways to fill our cups.

In May's book, she describes a season in life where both she and her husband experience medical scares, which call them into a season of withdrawal and restoration. Can you recall a time of life-changing shift, whether it be through medical, social, emotional, financial, or other means? How often do we take the time to Winter, to slow down and heal? When we are emotionally dis-membered, do we know how to take time to re-member — to come back to wholeness?

We need seasons of Wintering, just as the earth needs frost to strengthen spring growth.

I want to encourage each of us in the St. James community to take notice of the ways you are being called to "Winter." Where in your life can you slow down and recuperate? Where must you let go and cease from striving? In these cold months of January, February, and March...how will you allow yourself to embrace dormancy to grow strong for the Spring to come?

For me, this means slow walks through the park or out under the cold stars. It looks like lighting a candle as a reminder of God's light and faithfulness. It's deep, long nights of sleep, responding to the deep nights. The light is returning, but slowly, and that's ok.
